More than 160 cyclists completed a 900m course through The Village at Wellard as part of the 2019 Ring Summer Criterium Series in February.

The race was the third in the five-round criterium series and included nine events catering to all skill levels, from new racers to the more experienced and skilful competitors.

The closed streets provided a European race experience with a combination of cycle racing, fast downhill legs and cobblestone surfaces with great spectator viewing to watch the action unfold.



Twenty budding young cyclists took part in the Dome Little Critters lap, buoyed by the support from the crowd and very proud to receive their gift bag, medal and number plate. There was also plenty of action on the sidelines with a variety of giant games, free face painting, bike maintenance workshops and the 'Smoothie Bike' which had spectators working the pedals almost as hard as the competitors to blend their own smoothies!
