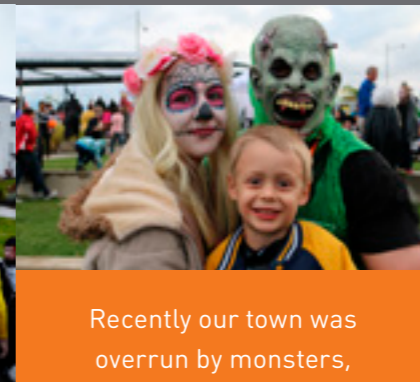
## QUEANBEYAN FAMILY DAY CARE

The warmer weather and consistent rainfall in late October and early November is helping with progress, especially with the landscaping works.

In November the Beltana Pond and Wetland system final restoration works were completed, and street tree planting in stages 5A, 5B and 6A has commenced.

Rockley Oval has welcomed the popular Tigers Auskick programme and Queanbeyan Junior Cricket, and will shortly be welcoming the Harman Hogs (to become the Googong Hogs) in 2016. Over the summer, Rockley Oval will transition from its winter to summer use, which means the removal of the winter rye grass, topdressing and fertilising to revitalise the summer couch cover. Current planning will see the oval handed over to Queanbeyan City Council in February.

At Duncan Fields the pavilion and grassing have been finalised, the floodlights and football posts are installed, and construction of the playground and surrounds is well underway.

Subdivision Stages 5A (67 lots), 6A (68) and 5B (85) were completed in October and registration of titles has occurred. This brings the total number of completed blocks in Googong North to 955 and works are underway on a further 365 lots in Stages 6D and Neighbourhood 1B Stages 1, 2, 3 and 4.

A development application has been lodged for the township's first shopping centre in Googong North. Works should commence early in 2016 and the first shops and childcare facilities are due to open early 2017.

Sales remain very strong as buyers continue to appreciate Googong's special offering.

## RECYCLED WATER UPDATE

With the commissioning of the Water Recycling Plant (WRP) in October, the supply of recycled water to Googong is getting closer.

We're using wastewater from Googong to test the WRP and ensure that the recycled water meets the relevant standards. This will continue until early 2016. Verification of consistent quality will follow for around 4-5 months, at which point we will hand operations over to Queanbeyan City Council (QCC).

You can help us with the testing and the ongoing operation of the WRP by being mindful of what you put down your sinks and toilet. Most importantly please remember to put the following in the bin:

✗ Oils	✗ Nappies and wet wipes
✗ Food scraps	✗ Personal hygiene products

Following the tests, recycled water will be available for non-potable uses such as gardening and toilet flushing, in early to mid 2016. It will also be used to irrigate playing fields and parks in Googong. Using recycled water will help to reduce consumption of potable drinking water in Googong by about 60%.

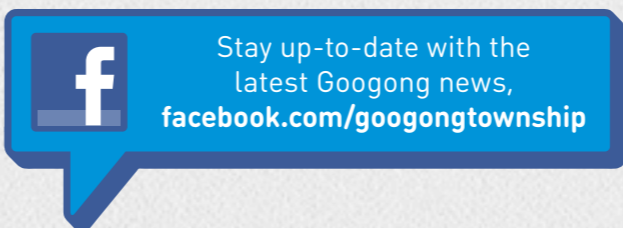
The Year 2 camp involved excited students sleeping at the school in their tents. The second day of camp saw the students build giant trebuchets that fired water bombs the full length of the school oval!

## UPDATE FROM OUR LOCAL RURAL FIRE SERVICE JERRABOMBERRA CREEK

The Fire Season is here so here are a few tips to help get your property ready for possible fires.

- TRIM** overhanging trees and shrubs.
- MOW** your lawn and remove all the cut grass.
- REMOVE** material that can burn around your home (e.g. door mats, wood piles, mulch, leaves, paint, outdoor furniture).
- CLEAR** and remove all the debris and leaves from the gutters surrounding your home.
- PREPARE** a hose or hoses that can stretch all around the house.

There are some helpful apps that you might find useful, including *Fires near me*, and *My Fire Plan*.
